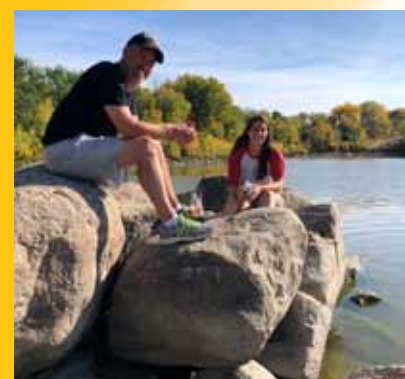

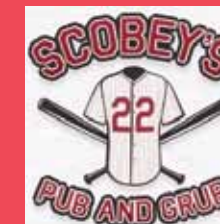

Historic Downtown



CROOKSTON'S HISTORIC DOWNTOWN BUSINESS DISTRICT

Crookston has the largest, most architecturally intact concentration of late 19th and early 20th century commercial buildings in the region. Placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1984, the historic business district includes approximately 30 structures. Free self-guided walking tour booklets are available at the Crookston Area Chamber of Commerce at 103 South Broadway, 218-281-4320 www.visitcrookston.com.

Fun facts about downtown's historic buildings were displayed at the Downtown Crookston Development Partnership's first annual Historic Halloween Candy Hunt event in 2020 and included information on some of the area's more prominent structures. Here are some of the highlights from the shared information:

- The Grand Theatre on Second Street was built in 1910 and once housed a candy store and a business college. It had its own orchestra pit that can still be seen in the front of the theatre and had many famous people perform there such as Mark Twain, Roy Rogers, and Boris Karloff. The Grand is also known as one of the country's longest continuously-operating motion picture theaters.

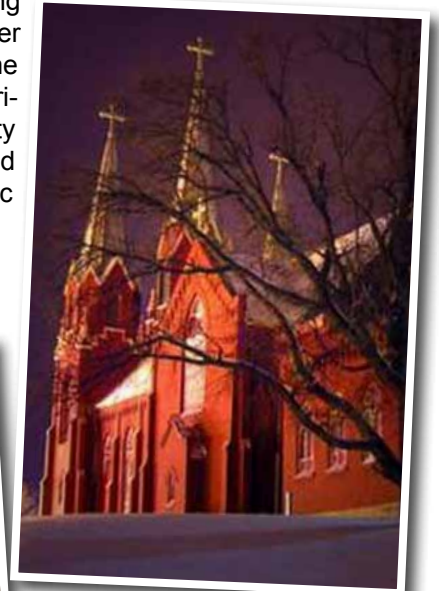
- The Old Cathedral on Ash Street was built in 1912 by Bert Keck with three spires and was added to the National Register in 1989. After the new Cathedral was built the old Cathedral's ownership was transferred to the Care and Share to expand services to the homeless.

- The Montagues Flower Shop Building on Main Street was built in 1900 and was originally used by the Minneapolis Brewery as a saloon. In 1904, Peter Stuhl had a shooting gallery inside the

yellow brick building that has four jack-arched windows on the second story.

- The Old City Hall Building on South Broadway was built in 1899 by E.H. Strassburger and was a former home to Crookston Police Station, Crookston Fire Department and Eickhof Columbaria. Its upper 10 foot pyramidal roof was removed in 1979-80 and now houses the gift and decor shop Willow & Ivy.

- The Fournet Building on North Broadway was built in 1885 for \$15,000 by Felix Fournet who was a wholesale liquor dealer and hotelman. It was the former home of the New York Store, Johnson Drug, Minnie I. Boe Agency, Dr. A.E. Lucian Dentist, Montgomery Ward, Munn's Jewelry and Four Seasons Clothing. The building is currently being renovated by owner Jeff Evers and is the future home of Tri-Valley Opportunity Council, Inc. and Polk County Public Defenders Office."

The Grand Theatre

Glacial Ridge National Wildlife Refuge

A partnership of nearly 30 organizations, this is the largest tall grass prairie restoration project in the nation. Approximately 20 miles east of Crookston, this prairie wetland complex host a great diversity of plant species, bird species, butterflies, mammals, amphibians and reptiles. Recent sightings include bald eagles and visitors can enjoy watching prairie chickens from blinds during the spring mating season. Contact www.fws.gov for a day of wildlife watching, photography, education or hunting.

Red River Natural History Area

The Red River Natural History Area is a tract of approximately 85 acres in the flat lake bed of glacial Lake Agassiz less than one mile from the University of Minnesota Crookston campus. It has been established as a living museum and teaching laboratory by the University of Minnesota. Use of the area is limited to educational groups and individuals having serious natural history interests. Red River Valley Sugar Beet Museum

Carnegie History Center

The Crookston Carnegie Public Library was built between 1907 and 1908 and was placed on the National Historic Registry in June of 1984. The building serves as a library for historic newspapers and books as well as art displays and traveling exhibits. The building is owned and operated by the Polk County Historical Society who has lovingly has made it their mission to preserve this historical landmark. Shaver Butterfly Garden

The Shaver Butterfly Garden is a unique horticulture display located on the vibrant University of Minnesota Crookston campus. It contains a special mixture of plants selected because of their preference by butterflies. A tribute to long time Crookston resident June Shaver, an ardent supporter of the University of Minnesota Crookston, who established the June Shaver Environmental Landscaping Internship Fund in 2006 with a gift of more than \$30,000. It is through this endowment that UMN Crookston students enjoy financial and academic promise as University of Minnesota undergraduates.

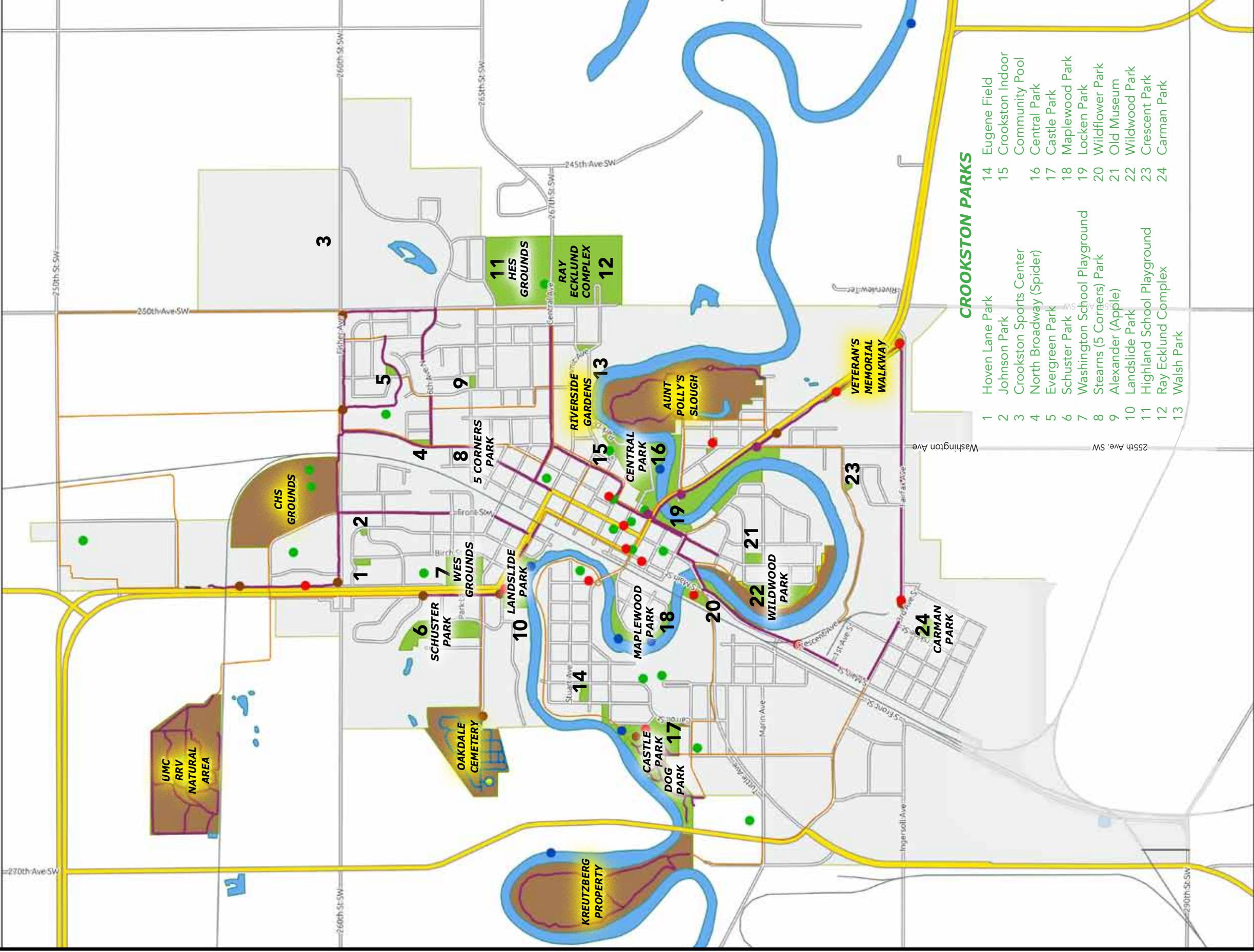

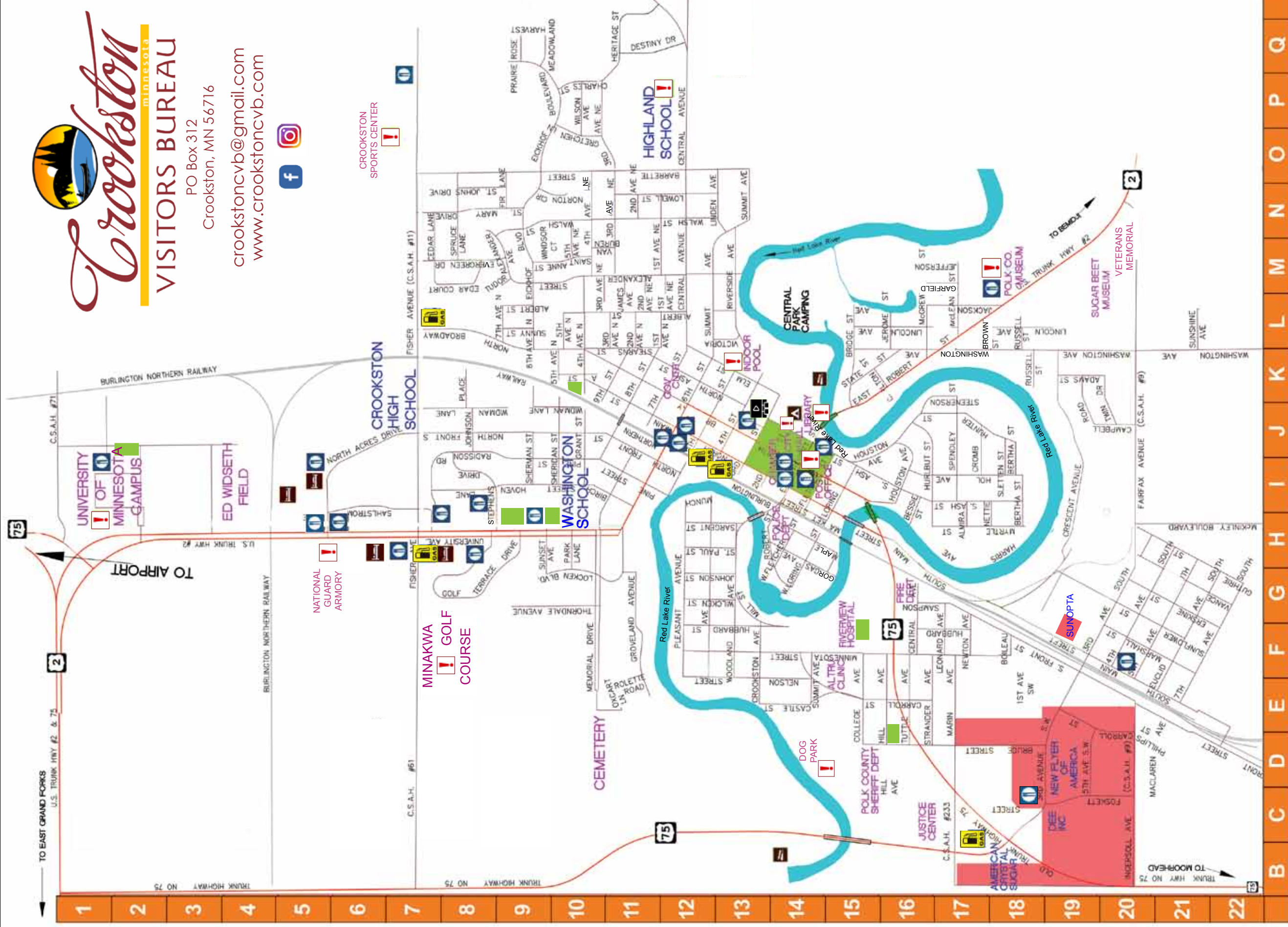
